COLORADO STATE CONFERENCE AUGUST 15, 2020 -MINUTES

The first session of the business meeting of the Colorado State Delta Kappa Gamma Society was called to order at 8:43 am. Maggie Hunt gave a short presentation about mindfulness and enjoying the moment.

Roll call was taken and a quorum was established. The minutes of the June Convention of 2019 were reviewed. It was moved by Dr. Barb Whinery and seconded by Lily Vigil that the minutes be approved as read. The minutes were approved as read.

The report of the By-laws and Standing Rules Team was given by Cynthia Mousel. The team suggested that the vote on the Appendices of the document be postponed until the final draft of the Appendices are distributed to the state executive board. The motion was seconded by Elizabeth Barzdukas. The motion was approved.

Lily Vigil gave a budget report. See Attachment. Lilly Vigil (representing the Finance Team) moved that the members attending the full Colorado State Conference have the opportunity to apply for a lifelong learning scholarship for the amount paid for their registration. Motion passed. Lilly reminded members that she needs a CORRECT address and stated that all attendees will receive a lifelong learning scholarship for the amount of the conference registration. Attendees can also turn in a voucher for mileage.

There is a signer on the financial documents that needs to be removed from all official documents since Farabe Smith is no longer a resident of Colorado and is no longer a member of the Colorado Delta Kappa Gamma Society. The Society approved the removal of Farabe Smith as a signer of all financial accounts.

Suzanne Foster moved that the proposed 2020/21 budget be approved. Sarah Helman seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The final two team reports were postponed until later in the day. The business meeting was adjourned at 9:47 am.

Meeting was called back to order at 1:00 pm. Laurie Salazar gave a report for the Nominations Team. Nominations for state officers are due November 15, 2020. Officers will be selected for the 2021-2023 biennium. The Nominations Team serves for 4 years.

The Membership Team recognized those who were attending the Leadership Conference for the first time. They then gave a presentation on how to recruit new members.

To finish the meeting, Kathy Flynn outlined a brief history of the founders of the Colorado State Delta Kappa Gamma Society (formerly the Omega State Delta Kappa Gamma Society). We are 84 years young!!

Team Updates <u>BYLAWS AND STANDING</u> <u>RULES TEAM</u>

Happy Spring brings changes. The first was the approval at the Spring Executive Board Meeting of the proposed changes to the Colorado State

Organization Standing Rules (see the approved proposal below). It further defines electronic meetings in the "virtual" time. The second item is to alert members that they can suggest changes to the International Constitution and Standing Rules. This is where "member driven, member governed" takes on some real meaning. See the article on this in the DKG News, March/April, page 10. Watch for proposed amendment forms posted on the DKG website and visit the Constitution/ISR page to view a video on the process. There will likely be a workshop on this as well as the updating of chapter rules at the Colorado State Organization Convention this June in Eagle, Colorado. Approved by the Colorado State Organization Executive Board, March 20, 2021

The Colorado State Organization Bylaws and Standing Rules Team recommended the following statement be added to the Colorado State Organization Bylaws 2019 ARTICLE X Section E. Add statement: Refer to Colorado State Organization Standing Rules 2019. V. ACTIVITIES B. Publications/Electronic Communications C. Electronic Colorado State Organization Meetings. The Colorado State Organization Bylaws and Standing Rules Team recommended approval of the proposed amendment to the Colorado State Organization Standing Rules 2019:

V. ACTIVITIES

C. Electronic Colorado State Organization Meetings 1. Executive Board members may vote at electronic meetings just as if they were at face-to-face meetings, providing members will have the opportunity to debate and to amend motions, just as they would have done at face-to-face meetings. 2. If there is no meeting, electronic votes must be ratified at the next face-toface or electronic meeting of the group when members will have the opportunity to debate or emend motions on which ethyl have voted. **3.** To facilitate electronic voting at Executive Board meetings on such items as proposed amendments, a nominations report, a proposed financial budget, team recommendations, written recommendations shall be sent to all Executive Board members 30 days prior to the Executive Board meeting. Team leaders are responsible for sending the written recommendations to their respective team members. 4. To facilitate electronic voting at State Conventions on such items as proposed amendments, nomination reports, budget items, team recommendations. written recommendations shall be published in the April issue of the Colorado Peaks and Plains and distributed to all Colorado State Organization members. 5. At meetings held electronically, the requirement for a ballot vote may be waived by majority vote of those present and voting. 6. a Quorum must be present for electronic meetings, just as for faceto-face meetings.

Colorado State Organization Standing Rules 2019 V. ACTIVITIES C. Electronic Colorado State Organization Meeting was approved at the Colorado State Organization Spring Executive Board, thus current lettering will be changed in the Standing Rules 2019: Colorado State Directories D.; Leadership Conferences E.; Scholarship F.; Special Awards G,; and Legislative Platform H.

ROAD SCHOLAR SCHOLARSHIPS

Travel the world without leaving home. Due to the pandemic travel restrictions, Road Scholar is offering a wide variety of virtual programs. Information can be found at Online Classes for Seniors| Virtual Distance Learning <<u>roadscholar.org</u>>. Sign up for their emails and watch for their specials.

The scholarship team has decided to offer \$100 Road Scholarships for the virtual programs that are \$399 or more. This would be for the 4 day or longer programs which are usually 2-3 hours every day.

The requirements will be the same as for the regular scholarship as found in the Appendix II G. These virtual scholarships will be offered through the end of 2021.

Who else loves a good nonfiction book? I know that I do. My latest read is called <u>The 1935 Republican River Flood</u> by Joy Hayden. This book was SO interesting to me since the South Fork of the Republican ran right through our family ranch, southeast of Arriba, Colorado.

In 1935, the drought and Great Dust Bowl of the 1930s had been raging for years. The Black Sunday Dust Storm had happened on April 14, 1935, the area along the Republican River was as dry as everywhere else. The people who lived there didn't believe that they would ever be in danger from flooding. The morning of May 31, and subsequent days would prove them wrong. The rain began to fall at around 3:00 am on May 31st. Because of the many years of drought, the rain could not soak into the ground, but ran off and into the river basin.

This book gives a great many details of the flood. One man who lived one mile west of Siebert, Colorado was washed away. When his body was finally found, it was at Sharon Springs, Kansas. 
